#### Recommendation

That the Board of Trustees approves the unaudited financial report for the period ended December 31, 2016 as presented at the Regular Meeting of February 7, 2017.

#### **Background**

The Quarterly Financial reports are part of the Accountability responsibility and authority of the Corporate Board, as defined and directed by Policy A3: Accountability. The Budget year for our Learning Organization commences September 1 of each year and concludes on August 31. Within the context of a full school year, Administration provides four Quarterly Financial reports as follows:

- First Quarterly Report (January)
- Second Quarterly Report (April)
- Third Quarterly Report (June)
- Audited Financial Statements (November of the subsequent school year)

The Board will recall that in November 2016 it received and approved the Audited Financial Statements for the 2015-2016 school year. The Monthly Financial Statement included within this agenda is for the period ended December 31, 2016. The Audited Financial Statements for the current school year will be presented to the Board in November 2017. With each financial report, sites are expected to be at or below the percentage thresholds defined by the point within the budget/reporting cycle. The Financial Statements include details on any variances within any site reports that are greater than 2%. For example, the Transportation Site Budget will show a higher percentage used in all quarterly statements because the Transportation Department expends its annual budget over a ten-month period rather than a twelve-month period.

#### Recommendation

That the Board of Trustees of Parkland School Division No. 70 read By-Law No. 1-17, "Rearrangement of the Electoral Wards and Trustee(s) to be Elected to Each Ward", a first time this February 7, 2017.

#### **Background**

Pursuant to the School Act, RS 2000, Chapter S-3, s. 210 (d), the Board of Trustees seeks approval by way of a Ministerial Order setting out the boundaries of the new wards as described in the attached bylaw.

In 2013, Parkland School Division's Trustees identified concerns with the current electoral wards. Specifically, it was felt that they no longer reflected the democratic principle of representation by population.

The Board recognizes that, once elected, Trustees represent the entire School Division. Parkland School Division's Board already reflects this principle, with many Trustees acting as the primary contact for schools outside their Wards.

In early 2015, Parkland School Division's Board engaged Russell Farmer and Associates Consulting Ltd to support a review of the current ward structure, and to provide options for realignment.

The Trustees assessed options trying to balance the principle of representation by population with the challenges of representing large geographic areas of the School Division.

The Board considered several potential models before identifying an option that it believes achieves the desired balance.


Highlights of the proposed model include:

- Adjusted electoral boundaries that address the current disparity in population between wards
- Retaining a total of seven (7) Trustees for the School Division
- A move from four (4) to three (3) Wards outside the large urban centres of Spruce Grove and Stony Plain, and an increase from three (3) to four (4) trustees representing the large urban centres
- Stony Plain to be represented by one (1) trustee
- Spruce Grove to be represented by three (3) trustees
- "Room to Grow" has been built into the model to ensure that anticipated population growth will allow the proposed Wards to meet the School Division's needs into the future.



The Board of Trustees directed Administration to collect feedback on the proposed changes in electoral boundaries at the Regular Board Meeting of November 3, 2015. Trustees presented the proposed changes at municipal council meetings with the City of Spruce Grove, Town of Stony Plain and Parkland County, The proposed changes were also shared at School Council meetings and an online feedback form was available on the website for further public input. Concerns relating to ensuring representation in Stony Plain and Spruce Grove culminated in revisions to the proposed ward structure. The Board of Trustees is now required to request approval of the minister for the redivision of wards from six (6) to five (5) with the total number of Trustees elected to wards remaining unchanged at seven (7).

# The Parkland School Division No. 70 (the "School Division")

# A By-Law of the School Division in the Province of Alberta, relating to the rearrangement of the electoral wards and trustee(s) to be elected to each ward

Whereas the Board of Trustees of the School Division (the "Board") requests the Minister, by Ministerial Order pursuant to s.210(d) of the *School Act*, rearrange the wards of the School Division into five (5) wards as follows:

- a. Ward 1 (Seba Beach, Wabamun, Tomahawk, Entwistle, Duffield and Area)
- b. Ward 2 (Parkland Village, Muir Lake and Area)
- c. Ward 3 (Blueberry, Graminia and Area)
- d. Ward 4 (Town of Stony Plain)
- e. Ward 5 (City of Spruce Grove)

Subject to the Minister completing the Ministerial Order as requested above and subject to the Minister's approval of this Bylaw, the Board hereby resolves:

- 1. Pursuant to s. 262(5), the number of trustees to be elected for each ward is as follows:
  - a. One (1) trustee shall be elected from Ward 1
  - b. One (1) trustee shall be elected from Ward 2
  - c. One (1) trustee shall be elected from Ward 3

  - e. Three (3) trustees shall be elected at large from Ward 5

Ward 4 (Town of Stony Plain) shall be comprised of the following lands:

The lands lying within the municipal boundaries of The Town of Stony Plain.

Ward 5 (City of Spruce Grove) shall be comprised of the following lands:

The lands lying within the municipal boundaries of The City of Spruce Grove.

As set out in s.262(6) of the *School Act*, this bylaw shall take effect on the date of the next general election for the Board.

Subject: 2016-2017 CLASS SIZE REPORT

#### Recommendation

That the Board of Trustees receives as information the 2016-2017 Class Size Report as presented at its Regular meeting February 7, 2017.

#### **Background**

As part of the re-engineering of the Small Class Size Initiative grant, Alberta Education continues to implement differential Basic Student rates as a component of base instruction for ECS, Grades 1-3, as well as differentiated rates for specific Career and Technology Studies (CTS) courses.

Alberta's *Class Size Information System* is available for calculating class size averages at the school and jurisdiction levels. Boards are required to use the Jurisdiction Report generated by the Class Size Information System to post their annual class size survey results with their Annual Education Results Report each year.

Class size funding is based on a per student grant. The Class Size Initiative funding formula focuses on:

- reducing class sizes in Kindergarten to Grade 3, and
- enhancing funding for specific Career and Technology Studies (CTS) courses to address safety and teacher/student ratios.

The Alberta Government does not specify a maximum class size. Schools and school boards are in the best position to determine classroom organization that supports parent and student educational choice.

The class size funding formula allocates funds based on a specific grade level or specific CTS courses. School jurisdictions have the flexibility to hire or retain teachers in any grade based on local needs. This approach allows a more strategic and flexible approach for local boards in their decision making.

Class size averages measure the actual number of students being taught by a certificated teacher in one classroom. Class size averages are therefore typically higher than student/teacher ratios. Student/teacher ratios measure the ratio of students to all professional staff that provide classroom services and support. Student/teacher ratio includes counselors, teaching assistants, librarians, principals and central office staff.

# Occupational Health & Safety Report

Employers and employees are now well versed in the Occupational Health and Safety Act. Both partners are expected to adhere to stricter codes of conduct in an on-going effort to protect employees from workplace incidents. The Occupational Health and Safety Act continually evolves as required by industry and government.

Workplace incidents within Parkland School Division can result in Worker's Compensation Board (WCB) claims or Alberta School Employee Benefit Plan (ASEPB) claims. These claims make a significant impact on Parkland School Division. There is always a human impact.

Financial implications can present in a number of ways: increased premiums, and cost of replacing staff for both short term and long term injuries. Prolonged claims can have a significant impact on teaching and learning. We always work to reduce class disruption and to support student learning.

Parkland School Division has had a comprehensive health and safety program for several years and is now well into the maintenance stage of the program. Various PSD departments are involved in monitoring the program while working with managers and administrators to ensure compliance with the OH&S Act. Occupational Health and Safety has become part of the culture at Parkland School Division.

## Purpose of Parkland School Division's Occupational Health and Safety Program:

- To assist Parkland School Division in meeting or exceeding legislated requirements as set out in the Alberta Occupational Health and Safety Act and Code
- To provide guidelines and standards that will address the safety of all staff, students, contractors, volunteers
  and visitors in an ongoing manner.
- To provide on-going health and safety training for all staff in order to increase awareness.

An effective Health and Safety program will often result in:

- Cost savings because of fewer WCB claims
- Less disruption for students because of fewer staff claims

## **Current Progress:**

This past year the following tasks were completed:

- Assisting all administrators with proper usage of the PSD Health and Safety Manual including Safe Work Procedures
- Assisted all administrators in updating their site specific emergency response plans.
- Some of the Health and Safety training courses are completed on a yearly basis such as:
  - Health and Safety Orientation
  - Hazard Assessment Training

- Other training modules are completed every two or three years such as:
  - Employee Accident & Exposure Reporting
  - Reporting a Safety Hazard
  - Slips, Trips and Falls
  - WHMIS
- Claims are reviewed on an ongoing basis (HR),
- Investigations are conducted when required (Administrators) and,
- Safety concerns are rectified in a timely manner (Facilities).

## **Looking ahead:**

Occupational Health and Safety is an on-going commitment for employers. The Act and Code continue to evolve from year to year. Naturally this necessitates that an employer's Health and Safety Program will change and evolve to meet or exceed the legislated requirements.
