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### **Recommendation**

That the Board of Trustees approves the monthly financial report for the period ending December 31, 2014 as presented at the Regular Meeting of February 3, 2015.

### **Background**

The Quarterly Financial reports are part of the Accountability responsibility and authority of the Corporate Board, as defined and directed by Policy A3: Accountability. The Budget year for our Learning Organization commences September 1 of each year and concludes on August 31. Within the context of a full school year, Administration provides four Quarterly Financial reports as follows:

- First Quarterly Report (January)
- Second Quarterly Report (April)
- Third Quarterly Report (June)
- Audited Financial Statements (November – of the subsequent school year)

The Board will recall that in November 2014 it received and approved the Audited Financial Statements for the 2013-2014 school year. The Monthly Financial statement included within this agenda is for the period ended December 31, 2014. The Audited Financial Statements for the current school year will be presented to the Board in November 2015. With each financial report, sites are expected to be at or below the percentage thresholds defined by the point within the budget/reporting cycle. The Financial Statements include details on any variances within any site reports that are greater than 2%. For example, the Transportation Site Budget will show a higher percentage used in all quarterly statements because the Transportation Department expends its annual budget over a ten month period rather than a twelve month period.

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### **Recommendation**

That the Board of Trustees approves the Fees and Allowances for 2015-2016 as presented at the Regular Meeting of February 3, 2015.

### **Background**

#### ***Transportation Fees:***

In Alberta, Section 51(3) of the *School Act* states that a Board may charge a parent of a student receiving transportation provided by the Board any fee determined by the Board.

Parkland School Division provides student bus services to Kindergarten to Grade 12 students:

- who reside more than 2.4 kilometers from their designated school site (eligible – funded).
- who reside less than 2.4 kilometers and more than 0.9 kilometers from their designated school site provided an urban bus pass is purchased (ineligible – unfunded).

Parkland School Division's practice is that Urban ineligible students pay the approved fee to a maximum family rate. If the student does not attend their designated school, a cross boundary fee is implemented. Rural students are charged only the cross boundary fee where applicable. In order to balance the transportation budget, the Board established a transportation surcharge in 2013-2014. No increase in fees is recommended for 2015-2016.

#### ***Instructional Material Fees:***

In Alberta, Section 60(2) of the *School Act* states that a Board may charge a parent of a student fees with respect to instructional supplies and materials. No increase in fees is recommended.



***Non-Resident Tuition Fees:***

A resident student is an individual who is entitled to have access to an education program under Section 8 of the *School Act* and who is a resident student as determined under Section 44 of the *School Act*. Fees are charged for non-resident students and are reviewed annually. To align with our administrative procedure 301, we have changed the name in Item 4.6 from Foreign Students Program to International Students. No increase in fees is recommended.

That the Board of Trustees considers the closure of Keephills School effective June 30, 2015 and that the Board's decision on this potential closure be made at the Regular Board Meeting to be held April 8, 2015 as presented at its Regular meeting February 3, 2015.

### Background

Parkland School Division believes that students must have every opportunity to receive high quality programming in order to achieve learner outcomes of Alberta Education. This requires assurance that students will have access to resources, supports and services that foster the development of students who are able to achieve our ultimate goal of *Student Success and Well-being*. To that end and with stewardship of resources in mind, it is timely and essential that our Board considers the viability of Keephills School.

Dating as far back as 2001, Parkland School Division began a five stage study to look more closely at school facilities, space utilization and grade configurations. Declining enrollment at Keephills School has been witnessed yearly over the past decade and this has resulted in on-going monitoring including assessment of trends and study of educational and financial impacts.

There are currently 40 (gr.K-6) students at Keephills School. Given the projected enrollments and the financial realities facing Parkland School Division there are serious questions about whether we can ensure a viable educational program for the students of Keephills School in the future.

This notice of motion is intended to launch a process that provides opportunity to consider all sides of this situation, to hear from stakeholders and to prepare Trustees for informed conversation when the time comes to make a decision about the future of Keephills School. An attached timeline outlines process and critical dates as mandated by *PSD Board Policy 15* and *Alberta School Act – Closure of Schools Regulation*.

### Recommendation

That the Board of Trustees receives as information the 2014-2015 Class Size Report as presented at its Regular meeting February 3, 2015.

### Background

As part of the re-engineering of the Small Class Size Initiative grant, Alberta Education has instituted differential Basic Student rates as a component of base instruction for ECS, Grades 1-3, as well as differentiated rates for specific Career and Technology Studies (CTS) courses. This approach, effective September 1, 2010, was implemented to allow a more strategic and flexible approach for local boards in their decision making, especially in the area of Kindergarten to Grade 3. Although the class size formula allocates funds based on a specific grade level or specific CTS courses, boards have the flexibility to hire or retain teachers in any grade based on local circumstances. For example, although class size funds are not allocated for students in Grades 4 to 9, class size funding may be directed to these classrooms if this is a priority.

Jurisdictions are required to submit class size information to Alberta Education by December 31 and must post their annual class size survey results in their Annual Education Results Report (AERR) each year..

Attached are both the jurisdiction and individual school class size reports.

Parkland School Division has become well versed in the Occupational Health and Safety Act. Both employees and employers are expected to adhere to strict codes of conduct in an on-going effort to protect employees from workplace incidents. The Occupational Health and Safety Act continually evolves as required by industry and government.

Workplace incidents within Parkland School Division can result in Worker's Compensation Board (WCB) claims or Alberta School Employee Benefit Plan (ASEPB) claims. These claims make a significant impact on Parkland School Division. There is always a human impact. Prolonged claims can have a significant impact on teaching and learning. We always work to reduce class disruption and to support student learning. Financial implications can present in a number of ways: increased premiums, and cost of replacing staff for both short term and long term injuries.

Parkland School Division has had a comprehensive health and safety program for several years and is well into the maintenance stage of the program. Various PSD departments are involved in monitoring the program while working with managers and administrators to ensure compliance with the OH&S Act. Occupational Health and Safety has become part of the culture at Parkland School Division.

## **Purpose of Parkland School Division's Occupational Health and Safety Program:**

- To assist Parkland School Division in meeting or exceeding legislated requirements as set out in the Alberta Occupational Health and Safety Act and Code
- To provide guidelines and standards that will address the safety of all staff, students, contractors, volunteers and visitors in an ongoing manner
- To provide on-going health and safety training for all staff in order to increase awareness

An effective Health and Safety program will often result in:

- Cost savings because of fewer WCB claims
- Less disruption for students because of fewer staff claims

## **Recent Progress:**

This past year the following tasks were completed:

- Assisted all administrators with proper usage of the PSD Health and Safety Manual including Safe Work Procedures
- Assisted all administrators in updating their site specific emergency response plans
- Orchestrated health and safety training; yearly courses such as:
  - Health and Safety Orientation
  - Hazard Assessment

- Modules completed every two - three years such as:
  - Employee Accident & Exposure Reporting
  - Reporting a Safety Hazard
  - Slips, Trips and Falls
  - WHMIS
- Claims are reviewed on an ongoing basis (HR),
- Investigations are conducted as required (Administrators) and,
- Safety concerns are rectified in a timely manner (Facilities).

**Looking ahead:**

Occupational Health and Safety is an on-going commitment, as the Act and Code continue to evolve from year to year. Naturally this necessitates that PSD's Health and Safety Program will continue to be modified to meet or exceed the legislated requirements.

Focus for the future:

- Parkland School Division will be implementing a new Smart phone app (from School Dude) that will house Emergency Response Plans (ERP) for all PSD sites. This app will initially be accessible by all administrative staff with other access permissions being available over time. In the case of an emergency; administrators will be able to access their ERP directly from their smartphones.
