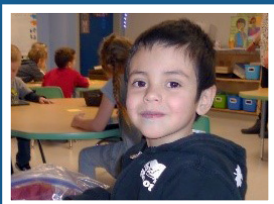

WELCOME

Early childhood is a significant period in human development. Independence, initiative, creativity, decision-making, the ability to learn and to relate to others and feelings of self-worth all begin in early childhood. What young children learn at this stage can impact their successful learning experiences in school, personal development and future participation in society.

At Parkland School Division (PSD), we strive to provide the best learning environments to support our youngest learners. As [Alberta's new curriculum](#) gets implemented across the province, the [Kindergarten Program Statement](#) and [Programs of Study](#) guide learner expectations and describe lessons appropriate for young children as a part of their learning pathway. Some children are already developing, or have developed, some of the learning described. Most children will achieve this learning before entering Grade 1. Others will continue to develop them during the primary school years.

Kindergarten is a wonderful way for your child to discover what school is like and to have fun while learning new things. In this exciting new community, children's natural curiosity and eagerness to learn are structured through organized activities and purposeful play.



ELIGIBILITY

A child entering kindergarten must be five years old by the last day of December of the school year in which he or she begins kindergarten. For example, a child registering for kindergarten in September 2025 needs to be five years old by December 31, 2025.









SCHEDULE

Regular kindergarten programs are offered on a Monday/Wednesday or Tuesday/Thursday full day schedule, plus alternating Fridays. Some schools offer additional kindergarten extension hours for a fee.

FRENCH IMMERSION

This program gives children an opportunity to become highly proficient in oral and written French and allows them to experience French culture. From kindergarten to Grade 3, students are primarily instructed in French. Formal English instruction is incorporated into the program, starting in Grade 3. The program is based on Alberta's approved curriculum. PSD's French Immersion schools are École Broxton Park School (K-9) and École Meridian Heights School (K-9).

NATURE PROGRAMMING

Nature programming is based at Muir Lake School and focuses on providing meaningful student engagement in a nature-based setting while addressing the kindergarten curriculum. Two nature streams are available:

- **Nature Kindergarten** which provides full-curriculum, including core academics that cover all aspects of the kindergarten programs of study.
- **Nature Enrichment** which serves as an extension to a regular kindergarten program, with a strong focus on health and life skills.

PSD CHRISTIAN PROGRAM

This program is available to students from kindergarten to Grade 9. Students learn in a non-denominational, spiritually nurturing and intellectually challenging environment. The program is offered at Brookwood School (K-4) and Woodhaven Middle School (5-9).

École Broxton Park School offers both full-time and part-time French Immersion kindergarten programs for PSD students. In both programs, students adapt to the school environment through a supportive, play-based approach, ensuring a smooth and confident transition into Grade 1. The full-time option provides double the language instruction fostering faster language growth and acquisition—helping to make most of their first year of learning French.
